Out With the Old

- ▶ Transition of mental health intakes
 - ▶ The right thing to do for most children and families
 - ▶ Board expressed concern to previous government about the process and communication of these changes
 - ▶ Loss of the entire mental health budget - 25% of entire CCN budget
 - ▶ Significant mental health component to several complex cases

In With The New- Coordinated Service Planning

- ▶ June 2015: the Sudbury-Manitoulin team submitted a proposal for Coordinated Service Planning (CSP) to the Ministry of Children and Youth Services (MCYS)
- ▶ January 2018: CCN was identified as the Coordinating Agency for CSP
- ▶ January-August 2018:
 - ▶ The CSP Working Group worked on implementation tasks
 - ▶ CCN developed internal processes and staff were trained in key areas
- ▶ September 2018: soft launch and then January 2019: full launch of CSP

In With The New- FASD Worker


- ▶ In December 2017, the Ministry of Children and Youth Services (MCYS) announced that it would be allocating funding to the Coordinating Agencies for Coordinated Service Planning (CSP) to employ an FASD Worker
- ▶ CCN hired an FASD Worker in March 2018, and has now completed training in the neuro-behavioural model proceeding to become a trainer in the model .
- ▶ CCN is currently working with local FASD service providers to develop a program that meets the needs of children, youth, families and the community

- ▶ November Board/Staff team building session


Looking Ahead to the Future

- ▶ Session built on Board's strategic approaches (board recruitment and meeting structures).




SOAR Approach

- ▶ Values: Leadership, Collaboration, and Resourcefulness




Goals
